Campfire Care

To keep the festival fun and also safe, we have some commonsense, Campfire rules:

BEFORE YOU LIGHT A FIRE

- To reduce fire risk, always check weather conditions in your camping area
- Do not light or maintain a campfire on dry and windy days
- Do not light a campfire if the Fire Danger Rating is very high, severe, extreme or catastrophic or during a total fire ban

BUILDING A SAFE CAMPFIRE

- Clear a location free from vegetation and litter; the fires should be no closer than 3 metres from any equipment or flammable objects
- Use a built fireplace, where provided, or dig a 20–30 cm trench to house the fire to prevent embers from escaping
- Create a border using rocks
- Never use fuels to start your fire

LOOKING AFTER THE FIRE

- Keep your fire big enough for cooking and keeping warm
- Use only fallen or dead wood
- Never leave your fire unattended
- Keep a bucket of water nearby

WHEN FIRE IS NOT IN USE

- Make sure the fire is completely extinguished, using water

Do not burn dangerous or flammable items such as aerosol cans, as they can explode

Do not put cans or other products in the fire that do not burn

Do not put glass in your campfire as it can melt, shatter or explode

Do not put unopened tins of food on the fire to cook as they can explode
